Choral Evensong on the Third Sunday of Easter

SUNDAY, MAY 5, 4:30 P.M.

Once a month, Saint Mark's unique Evensong Choir, which brings together the voices of highly-skilled children, teenagers, and adults, offers Choral Evensong in a traditional Anglican Cathedral style. On May 5 the choir will offer Charles Villiers Stanford's splendid setting of the Magnificat and Nunc dimittis in C major. The anthem will be a setting by Josef Gabriel Rheinberger's radiant *Abendlied*, a setting of Luke 24:29—the disciples' invitation to the resurrected Christ on the road to Emmaus, "Stay with us, for it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." (The final Choral Evensong of the season will occur on June 2, observing the Feast of the Ascension.)
