From now until June 20, 2019, Lawrence Pitre's series of paintings "We Are One" will be on exhibit in the Cathedral Nave. The paintings address Seattle's Central District as a space where memories of our past, present, and contemporary life intersect. His bold figures invite us to remember the stories that connect us to a city, to a place, and most importantly, to one another.

A conversation with the artist will occur in Bloedel Hall between the 9 and 11 a.m. services, from 10:10 to 10:55 a.m., and a reception featuring thoughts from the artist and refreshments will occur in the Nave after the 11 a.m. service, from 12:15 to 1:15 p.m.

Though Many: Historical Photographs of Saint Mark's Now on Display in the Hallway Gallery

As a companion to Pitre's exploration of historical memory in his paintings, the Visual Arts Ministry has selected photographs and artifacts from the Cathedral and Diocesan archives for display in the semicircular Hallway Gallery, located on the upper level of Cathedral House. The exhibit, titled "Though Many" invites us to consider the layers of memory that this place holds, and how this history continues to shape who we are as a community.
