Heritage Sunday Celebrations Today

TODAY, MAY 26, AT ALL MORNING SERVICES

We give thanks for all those whose legacies have enriched this community through the last 130 years, and we celebrate today with special intention to honor those whose faithful presence is a source of inspiration for us all. At the 8 and 9 a.m. services, we will include special prayers for Heritage Sunday, and at the 11 a.m. service, we will recognize those who have reached the auspicious age of 80 or more, those who have been members of Saint Mark's for 25 years or more, and all those who are members of the Cathedral Legacy Society. We welcome as our preacher today The Rt. Rev. Cabell (Cabby) Tennis who served as the fourth dean of Saint Mark's, 1972–1984, and later as Bishop of Delaware, before retiring back to Saint Mark's nearly twenty years ago.

Young Adults Questioning Together

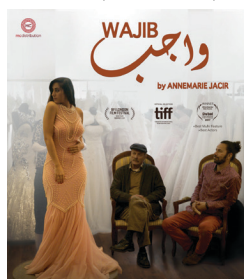
