Post-Compline Organ Recital by Seattle Service Corps Member Ryan Macias

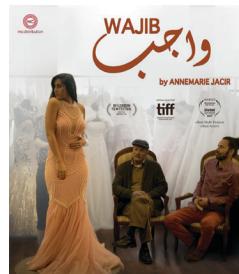
TONIGHT, JUNE 2, 10:00 P.M. (AFTER COMPLINE),
