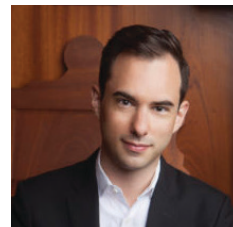

Organ Concert on the Flentrop

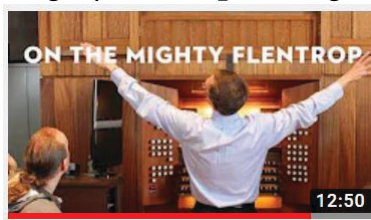
THIS FRIDAY, OCTOBER 18, 7:30 P.M., *Cathedral Nave*

DID YOU KNOW?

Mighty Flentrop video goes viral



Last May, as part of the first series of "On Saint Mark's Cathedral" videos by filmmaker David Wild, a 13-minute video featuring Canon Michael Kleinschmidt

introducing our beloved pipe organ was posted to Saint Mark's YouTube channel. For months it received just a few hundred views, but in July (for reasons that remain mysterious) Youtube began "recommending" the video to viewers around the world, and views went from a few a day, to a few thousand a day. The video has recently blown past the milestone of **100,000 views**. The video has 252 comments, many of which say it is the best organ introduction video they have ever seen. The cathedral's YouTube channel now has **over 1,000 subscribers**. All this for a video recorded in just one take, with no script! Credit for the success of this video must also be given to Kevin Johnson's masterful thumbnail image. 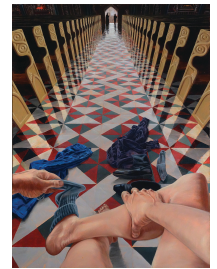

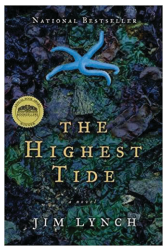

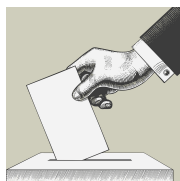
