Saint Mark's Sanctuary volunteers Dee Cappelletti, Melinda Kmitta, George Moore, and Maris Olsen will be travelling to McAllen and Brownsville, Texas, and Matamoros, Mexico, this week with Canon Nancy Ross as part of a team of Episcopalians from around the country witnessing and planning together to support refugees and asylees through the local ministries at the border. ## Wednesday Evening Programming Update

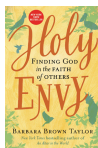
## Hunger Offering Today

## THE PLAY OF DANIEL

SATURDAY, JANUARY 18, 7:30 PM, *Cathedral Nave*  
The world-renowned Boston Camerata, joined by the choristers of Saint Mark's Choir School, presents a fully staged medieval masterpiece.

Called "the greatest musical play from the French Middle Ages," *The Play of Daniel* tells a resonant story of truth spoken to power and justice for the oppressed. In this staging, modern costuming, scenic design, and choreography attempt to recapture the energy and immediacy the work would have had for its first audience. In the words of Boston Camerata director Anne Azéma:

*"The Play of Daniel was intended for the raucous New Year's season, for youthful performers, and for a climate of topsy-turvy inversion of power. We in modern times still have those elements in our own year-end celebrations, and they are very strong in the Daniel play, alongside very serious religious and philosophical themes. The idea is to help all the dimensions of this complex work speak to a modern audience. 'Daniel' is serious fun, with the emphasis on both words."*

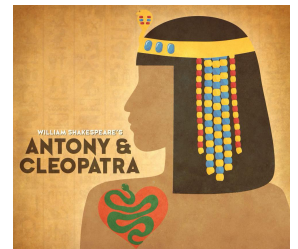
