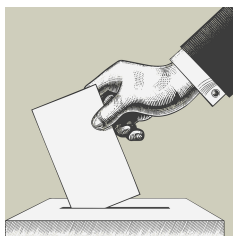

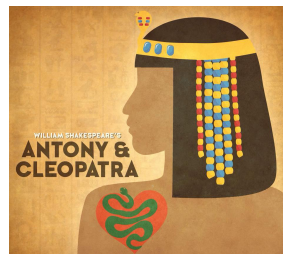

Alan DePuy (1966–2020)



Saint Mark's Cathedral is deeply saddened to announce the death of former parishioner and staff member Alan DePuy on Tuesday, January 14, after a brief illness. He was living in Germantown, Tennessee, where he had served as Director of Music at St. George's Episcopal Church since 2017. Alan served as Clerke of the Works (Facilities Manager)

and Assistant Organist at Saint Mark's from 2009 to 2014. A former child prodigy, Alan began playing the organ professionally at the age of 9. As a child, he played the organ at the Crystal Cathedral in Southern California, where he studied with legendary American organist Virgil Fox. His career as a church musician included positions at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Phoenix, Arizona, Holy Family Catholic Cathedral in Orange, California, and St. Thomas Episcopal Parish in Coral Gables, Florida, among others. A funeral will be held in Tennessee, followed by an interment of ashes in Phoenix. We bid your prayers for the repose of his soul, and for all who mourn.
