

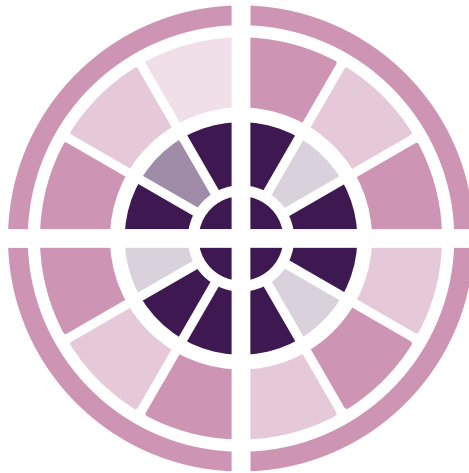

Officiant We know you as perfect Mercy and Love;
welcome Ellin in the grace of that love and mercy.

People **Hear our prayer.**

Officiant We praise you as the giver of life;
gather all who mourn into the hope of renewed life.

***People* Hear our prayer.**

Officiant The Church commends all who die to the care of Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit; and so we commend Ellin to you, giving thanks for the gift of her life.

***People* Hear our prayer.**

Officiant Most merciful God, whose wisdom is beyond our understanding: Deal graciously with Ellin's loved ones in their grief. Surround them with your love, that they may not be overwhelmed by their loss, but have confidence in your goodness, and strength to meet the days to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Officiant You only are immortal, the creator and maker of humankind; and we are mortal, formed of the earth, and to earth shall we return. For so did you ordain when you created me, saying, “You are dust, and to dust you shall return.” All of us go down to the dust; yet even at the grave we make our song: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

People **Give rest, O Christ, to your servant with your saints,
where sorrow and pain are no more, neither sighing,
but life everlasting.**

Officiant Into your hands, O merciful Savior, we commend your servant Ellin. Acknowledge, we humbly beseech you, a sheep of your own fold, a lamb of your own flock, a sinner of your own redeeming. Receive her into the arms of your mercy, into the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and into the glorious company of the saints in light.
